"Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32.)

Can you believe it's almost time for Lent? Well, not quite, but Lent begins in about a month, on March 5. Easter is relatively late, on April 20. During Lent you're invited to come together on six Sunday mornings beginning March 9, to talk about a timely topic: forgiveness. I still remember when I was a senior in high school, dating my very first boyfriend. He and I spent a lot of time with a friend of mine from summer camp. She didn't attend our high school, but I had invited her to a school event. To make a long story short, my friend and my boyfriend went behind my back and started dating. That was my first tender experience of trying to forgive them both for doing that. It hurt a lot, to say the least! Especially when you're 18 years old.

There are so many times and situations in our lives where forgiveness comes into play. How do we let go and forgive when we feel we have been wronged? If we don't forgive, feelings of anger and resentment can work their way into us and affect our health and our relationships.

Marjorie Thompson, a Presbyterian pastor, has written a wonderful (not too long) book called *Forgiveness A Lenten Study*.

Here is a description. "Forgiving others and humbly asking for forgiveness are central disciplines for all Christian believers. Lent, a

time to reflect on our Christian journey, is an appropriate time to deepen our understanding and practice of forgiveness..." In six brief chapters, Thompson addresses such questions as the following:

- Is forgiveness a Christian duty under all circumstances? Or are there situations when Christians do not need to forgive?
- Is forgiveness a matter between individuals, or is it meaningful only in the context of communities?
- Is forgiving the best route to healing for the injured?
- How do we get past emotional barriers to real forgiveness?

We'll meet Sunday mornings, 9:30-10:15, March 9-April 13. Books are available on Amazon for \$8.00. It's also available on Kindle. We'll be placing a group order, so if you'd like to order a book, please let Pastor Julia or Lynn in the office know.

Worship and Nurture



November 2024-January 2025

Session met in November, in person, the first time those not able to be with us She also continues to attend the preschool.

Faith continues to host discussions, now referred to as Collaborative Congregations, of several small churches in the Presbytery, led by the pastor at Springfield Covenant, Rev. Noble. The congregations are exploring ways to combine efforts to work together. Session also continues to monitor our financial situation and reduce expenses. A significant step was to change insurance companies resulting a savings of about \$6,000 a year. A second, significant, though regrettable, step was to reduce Pastor Julia's 2025 contract to 20 hours a week from the current 30 hours.

A Congregational Meeting has been scheduled for March 9 to review the annual reports and the 2025 budget.

- -Thanks for turning in your pledge card so that we could build the budget for 2025.
- -Because of the issues we have had with recycling being picked up consistently, we have cancelled the service and we are encouraging people to take recycling material home.
- -We changed our insurance to Church Mutual, effective 12/31/2024. Saving of about 30%.
- -Purchased new \$30,000 5-month CD for 4.4% after previously CD expired.
- -We are planning a Dusting Saturday for March 8th, with a chili lunch afterwards. More information to come.


