When I was searching for an appropriate message as we approach Election Day, I came across this prayer/poem in *The Presbyterian Outlook* online magazine. It's part of a series called "prayers for the moment." It was written before the candidates debated in September, but it is just as relevant, if not more so, now. It lifts up Jesus' parables as models for living. Here is the poem, written by Erin Weber-Johnson and Mieke Vandersall, August 29, 2024 |Updated: September 13, 2024.]

Oh God,

Another presidential debate, at its base, so simple:

Words and rhetoric and promises, all ultimate and urgent.

In your parables, you point to different ways of being. Can there be another way? Where our shared humanity is not questioned, bodies not valued as numbers but as beloved. Where we encourage the flourishing of the earth and each other?

In your parables, you speak of systems of inequity that greedily take a widow's last mite. Covenant between us, you, and the Earth. Teach us to share food with 5,000. Because here we find the miracle: there is enough.

Maybe that is our prayer to make a miracle out of struggle; to bring life to systems that break bodies; to move us to care for all our neighbors. I give you thanks, O LORD, with my whole heart.

Show us how to live, Christ Jesus. Amen.

The Book Club selection for this month is "Canary Girls" by Jennifer Chiaverini. Join us Wednesday Dec 18th at 1:30. The **Canary Girls** were British women who worked in munitions manufacturing trinitrotoluene (TNT) shells during the First World War (1914–1918). The nickname arose because exposure to TNT is toxic, and repeated exposure can turn the skin an orange-yellow color reminiscent of the plumage of a canary.



Advent study this year is called "*Patterns of Divine Possibility*." Through our readings and also some artwork, we'll be challenged "to embrace the complex, natural patterns of our creator in the world... to open our eyes to the intricate designs of God's creation that often go unnoticed and to explore faith as trusting in the unseen patterns and embracing a fuller understanding of God's handiwork."

August-October 2024

Session met in August, September, and October via Zoom. Pastor Julia continues to care for those not able to be with us on Sunday, including with visitations and communion. She also continues to attend PMV and UCC meetings and has resumed chapel for the preschool.

In July, Faith hosted a discussion by several small churches in the Presbytery, led by Rev. Jody Noble, pastor at Springfield Covenant. Rev. Noble encouraged the congregations to accept and adapt to change and to look at new ideas to try to get the congregation involved and try something not done before. Efforts continue to keep our web site and Facebook pages current and attractive. Session also continues to monitor our financial situation, noting that pledge income is in-line with the beginning of the year projections, though this still leaves a budget short-fall. We continue to look for ways to reduce expenses. Session agreed to host a second session, date to be determined.

New or revised policies will be drafted to include in the Policies and Procedures manual covering Pastor family leave, Anti-racism and harassment, sexual misconduct, and child and youth protection.

TEACHER OF THE MONTH


